# Pantry Days #12, 13, 14, & 15

October 15, Pantry #12. It was a warm beautiful sunshiny day. In addition to the usual fresh produce, 186 families received a variety of juices and milk. A total of 14,000 pounds of food was distributed.

November 12, Pantry #13. It rained and rained and rained. Stopping just a half hour before the end at 12pm. Our hard working volunteers did not let that deter them from their mission of making sure that every car left with bags/boxes of food. Included this time around was bags of apples, sweet potatoes, white potatoes, squash, and a variety of meats. The people came out in droves. They began to line up at 9am. The line was steady and very, very long. The last car served was at 11:55am. A total of 17,000 pounds of food was distributed to 194 families.

November 20, Pantry #14. It was turkey day! In contrast to November 12, it was a beautiful warm sunny day. The cars just kept on coming. Along with 232 turkeys being given away was fresh produce, stuffing, cranberry sauce, macaroni and cheese and other canned goods. It was smiles all around as 216 families knew they were going to have a festive Thanksgiving.

December 10, Pantry #15. On this chilly but crisp fall day, the sun did shine. There was a long line of cars with the earliest showing up at 8:30am for a 10am start time. Eighteen thousand pounds of food was distributed to 221 families. Recipients received fresh produce, meat, cereal, pasta, canned goods, paper goods and various toiletries. As always recipients were very appreciative.

The first Pantry Day was held in February 2019. From that time to February 2020, all pantries were walk ins. Due to COVID-19, as a safety precaution, drive-thru was implemented beginning in May 2020 continuing through December 22, 2020, the last Pantry Day for the year. No matter the weather, rain, shine, hot or cold, the pantries never shut down. The trucks came, the volunteers came and those who were in need of assistance came. They knew they could count on St. Mark. It was a very rewarding experience to see the smiles on the many faces of the recipients and to hear the very sincere thank yous .

Though the year is coming to an end the need for Food Pantries and other assistance will continue well into 2021. We can only hope and pray that things will get better in the new year. However, we must be prepared for the what ifs.

Sincerest thanks to the many volunteers who gave freely of their time, our coordinators Ramona Burnett and Diana Taylor and Maryland Delegate Michael J. Rogers for his support. We are very grateful to the Maryland Food Bank, AACO Food Bank and the AACO Partnership for Children, Youth and Families. 
